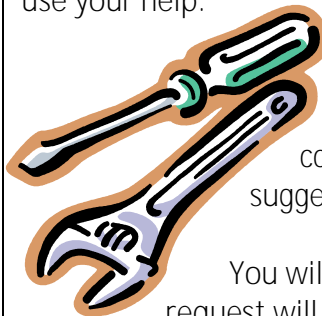
HELP REQUEST

The stated meeting of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Santa Barbara was held on September 28, 2010. Moderator Buehler called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM opening with prayer. A quorum was present.

Devotion: Moderator Buehler led a review of "Incongruence Code" from *Transforming Church*. Some of the thoughts shared were:

- Code is collective personality
- Each church has its own personality or code
- Code can be the essence or soul of the church
- From a subconscious level, members will resist any change if it is not in the church's code
- The trick is to identify the code - What is our code?

Peter's Post

Dear Friends,

By the end of October we'll have had well over a dozen Neighborhood Meetings. While the theme of the meetings has been a conversation about First Presbyterian Church -- our ministry, our plans and prayers, our vision -- we've also talked about church finances. I've been impressed that those of you who've attended have appreciated the information. You've listened carefully, asked good questions, and been open to the challenge to consider increasing your pledges for 2011 by six to ten per cent.

I'm gratified, not only because many of you are having to be careful with your own budgets, but also because talking about money can be awkward. While Jesus regularly brings up the subject in the Gospels, it can cause discomfort in his church. Personally I think it's because we are inclined to separate what we think of as secular things from sacred things, though the New Testament makes no such distinction. (Paul in 2 Corinthians 8 urges generosity by pointing to *the generous act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich*). The main idea is that generous giving is a way of discovering a wealth of faith. Why not talk about it!

The Neighborhood Meetings have also shown our excitement about the future. We're looking forward to a new Associate Pastor arriving in 2011, and to new steps in ministry connecting with younger adults (as well as older adults) and extending our already spirited outreach to our community. Your enthusiasm for these ventures is exhilarating. Please keep praying for the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee.

By the way, a special bonus: the Cherub Choir will sing on Commitment Sunday, November 14, the day we bring our pledges to church. I'm planning to get there early.

Naomi Faw tells about a student who came twice a week to the library where she worked. The student was legally blind and would sit at the same computer in the library every time she came. The student asked for the same kind of help every time. She asked for help reading what was on the screen. She needed help knowing how much she had written. She asked for help in proofreading. It was evident that she needed help from the assistance program. As these requests continued, irritation with the continued requests started to grow.

But one day, something changed. Naomi Faw saw things from a different perspective. She realized how much perseverance it took for this student to continue to pursue her education. And the long-ago-learned lesson came back to her. Seeing this experience in the light of Matthew 25:35, she thought of herself sitting with Jesus twice a week.

Remembering the compassion of Jesus who healed ten lepers, may all those from whom we would, at first, turn away, become for us the opportunity to encounter Jesus and a reason for giving thanks to God.

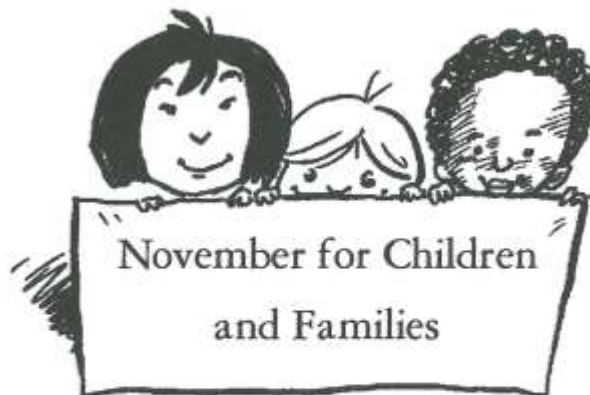

Healthful News



Did you miss the warm summer days this summer? I did. So *this* October my husband and I ventured out driving across the California desert into our neighbor state of Arizona. Visualizing the sunny panoramic views of the desert highways I found myself drifting with mindless thoughts and listening to the gentle whispers of an internal dialogue that seemed to go nowhere. I found rest in the quietness of our drive. The diversity of the terrain ranged from the brown, rock-laden hills of the Sonoran Desert with its occasional saguaro cactus and desert saltbrush, to the beautiful high desert of Oak Creek Canyon with its dramatic red buttes and monoliths. We finally ended our trip at the geological wonder of the mile deep and ten-mile wide Grand Canyon.

It has been over twenty years since I last visited the Grand Canyon with my children. As we strolled along the south rim admiring the vistas my eyes were diverted to a group of people surrounding a woman who had collapsed. In ninety-degree weather she had fallen straight down into a shrub bush and had landed in the dirt and on pavement. Her face bleeding, she lay motionless, speechless, and pale. Thankfully she was still breathing. A gentleman was elevating her legs and someone mentioned she was a diabetic. As someone went to get help, I frantically looked through her purse for glucose tablets. Slowly, she regained consciousness and was able to digest four glucose tablets. These glucose tablets saved her life. Severe hypoglycemia is a medical emergency that can often render a patient unconscious in such a way that they cannot help themselves.

The symptoms of low blood sugar can vary depending on how low your blood sugar drops. Mild hypoglycemia can make you feel hungry, your heart may beat fast, or you may feel

nervous or your skin may sweat or turn cold and clammy. In moderate hypoglycemia you may have vision changes, feel confused, have difficulty walking or feel unsteady on your feet. Severe hypoglycemia can cause you to pass out, cause seizures, coma, or even death. In a severe hypoglycemic incident a person's blood sugar levels have fallen too low to supply the body with energy for daily function. If you are a diabetic it is important to know your symptoms of hypoglycemia and to take steps to correct it quickly. Medical emergencies can occur when we least expect them. Being prepared is our best defense.

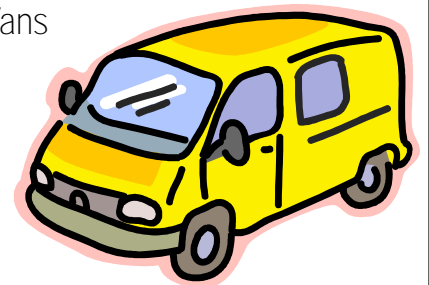
